SUSAN BROZEK SCOTT, a native of Springdale, Pa., and a 1980 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh with a bachelor of arts degree in rhetoric & communication, has extensive experience in front of and behind the camera. Her 28-year television career spanned four states and five stations where she amassed vast experience and critical acclaim as an award-winning anchor/reporter/talk show host and senior local programming producer.

Susan founded and is president and CEO of Afterschool Buddy, Inc., a Pittsburgh-based multimedia production company, now celebrating its 10th year. It produces educational and entertainment programming for children ranging from live shows and videos to in-school assemblies and summer camp programs. The company also produces video content for clients, including full-length documentaries, short videos, and educational series for web and DVD distribution.

Additional projects in the past year have had Susan producing videos for CBS All Access, Hulu, "Inside Edition," charitable foundations, labor unions and the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services.

Susan also stays active in the community. This summer, she will return for a fourth year as director of nonprofit Luminari's "I Want to Be an Ambassador!" program. The seven-day summer camp, June 11-19 in Pittsburgh and Washington, D.C., is designed to help teens master the skill sets and character traits of a successful ambassador, especially the vital art of diplomacy.

Susan was inducted into the Allegheny Valley School District Alumni Hall of Fame in 2011. She has hosted panels for multiple media outlets and associations and has been a featured speaker at local high schools, elementary schools and community events.

Susan is a strong proponent of investigative journalism and an advocate of increased transparency in government at all levels.

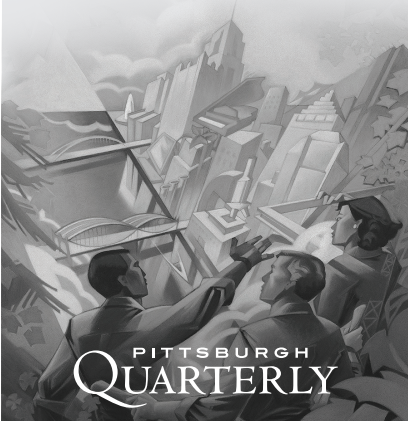

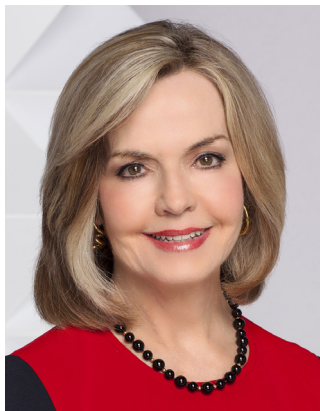

SERVICE TO JOURNALISM AWARD SALLY WIGGIN

SALLY WIGGIN retired from WTAE-TV in November 2018 after almost 39 years on the air. In her last year, she was the host of WTAE's "Chronicle" and the co-host of "Black and Gold Primetime."



Wiggin joined WTAE in 1980 and in January 1981 became co-anchor of the weekend news, a position she held until November 1986, when she was named anchor on the weeknight newscasts. She anchored the 11 p.m. news for 16 years and the 6 p.m. news for 22 years.

Her numerous professional honors include a Peabody Award, Associated Press Awards, RTNDA Edward R. Murrow Award, a regional Emmy, National Headliners Award, National Sigma Delta Chi Award, Golden Quill Awards and the Golden Quills' Ed King Memorial Award.

Wiggin was inducted into the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters Hall of Fame in 2015, the second female anchor to be inducted.

A native of Kalamazoo, Mich., she graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of Alabama and holds a master's degree in Asian studies from the University of Michigan.

Before moving to Pittsburgh, Wiggin worked at WBRC-TV and WSGN Radio, both in Birmingham, Ala.

Wiggin serves as a board member of several organizations including The Caring Foundation, Pittsburgh Zoo & PPG Aquarium, and Humane Animal Rescue. Her many community honors include being named Hadassah Women of the Year and a Carlow University Woman of Spirit. She served as honorary chairperson of the American Cancer Society Daffodil Days Campaign for 15 years. In 2009, she was honored as one of the YWCA's Women of the Year.

PRESIDENT'S AWARD
DAVID M. SHRIBMAN

DAVID M. SHRIBMAN, executive editor of the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* from 2003 to 2019, writes a nationally syndicated column in the United States; prepares a separate column on American affairs for the *Globe and Mail*, the national newspaper of Canada; and is scholar in residence at Carnegie Mellon University. He came to Pittsburgh from *The Boston Globe*, where he was assistant managing editor, columnist and Washington bureau chief.



He has served as national political correspondent for *The Wall Street Journal*, covered Congress and national politics for *The New York Times* and was a member of the national staff of *The Washington Star*. A native of Salem, Mass., a summa cum laude graduate of Dartmouth College and a Reynolds Scholar, he began his career at *The Buffalo Evening News*, where he worked on the city staff before being assigned to the paper's Washington bureau.

Shribman was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in 1995 for his writing on Washington and the American political scene. He led the coverage of the Tree of Life synagogue massacre that won the Pulitzer Prize for the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* a quarter-century later.

He has lectured at universities and colleges around the country and taught courses at Notre Dame, Brandeis, Virginia Commonwealth and Gettysburg College. He was a Poynter Fellow at Yale and delivered the Lyndon Baines Johnson Distinguished Lecture at Southwest Texas State University and the Charles Hall Dillon Lecture at the University of South Dakota.

Shribman is an emeritus member of the Board of Trustees of Dartmouth College and of the Board of Visitors of Dartmouth's Rockefeller Center for the Social Sciences. He is a member of the selection committee for the Profiles in Courage Award given by the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation and of the George H.W. Bush Service Award given by the Bush Library and serves as chairman of the selection committee of the Elijah Parish Lovejoy Award given by Colby College. He also sits on the national board of the Calvin Coolidge Foundation and holds four honorary degrees.
